Poetic Justice...or...The Mixmaster and Einstein's Theory of Relativity

There was a time when I wouldn't have thought that a boring conversation, a Mixmaster and Einstein's Theory of Relativity had anything in common with scripture, let alone with each other...but, now? Well, maybe I'd better start at the beginning.
